ATM Incident:	theft of ATM & cash complicity and/or conspiracy w/ A&B	D loaned A & B his truck to help them steal atm cash – If meeting of minds, then conspiracy	
	Attempted Theft: ATM & cash complicity or conspiracy w/ A&B	Intent plus substantial step if not deemed completed	
	ATM / Bank Property Damage/	on above theories	
	Bank Maybe Burg.Trespass etc	If invasion of bldg (weak)	
	hindering Prosecution/ complicity	trying to destroy/deface/remove evidence of crime - shooting and trying to remove plates	
	use gun in separate felony	using in above crimes - furtherance	
	Reckless endangerment of E and anyone else around./assault	Shooting at solid object when people were around – (MS discussed below, under death of E).	
	MS of C by complicity/conspiracy	if complicit in A& B's crimes, complicit in their recklessly causing death. Note - no FM	
Fiona Incident	theft or robbery of Car	jumped into car, turned key, drove away over F's objections; would be robbery if D's punch was sufficient force	
	Assault of F	D punched, and no aff. Dse of self Def for F: D was initial aggressor; could not use force against F. F's use of force possibly justified, but not D's Also, D had duty to retreat in public	
Bob Incident (Store)	Theft / Robbery (complicity with B)	Bob either shoplifted (theft) or robbed (force against clerk) the money from the store - if D joined crime BEFORE B reached place of temp safety, D is complicit	
	hindering prosecution	(defined above) if D DIDN'T join B's crimes in prog, he did pick B up: Bob clearly escaping w/ loot & D helps.	
E's Death	MS of E	reckless manslaughter of E, assuming causation issue resolved: E died in a car wreck.	
	“	weakness - Issue of whether D was direct legal cause. Rule out intervening and superseding cause. Note - only have to be A cause, not THE cause	
	“	Duty to rescue E after D caused his injury?	
	1 st Degree Murder: Police	If E was killed because he was a police officer – not really established on these facts, but E was investig. crime. - <i>mens rea</i> /causation issues though	
	2 ^d Degree Murder of E	If not 2 or more (below) and not b/c police; same issues of <i>mens rea</i> and causation	
A's Death	Solicitation/conspiracy/: A's murder	D ordered B to do it; if meeting of minds, conspir, but at least solicitation,	
	2 ^d Degree Murder of A /Assault	2 nd degree b/c he solicited her death	
	2 ^d Degree Murder of A	Note - B's lack of <i>mens rea</i> not attributable to A.	
	Murder (Att.M) / MS of A	Complicity in B's actions	
	Murder /atm/MS of A	Causation. Getting hit by car if injured in street foreseeable - A cause, not necess. THE cause.	
	MS of A	EMED / Recklessness	
Multiple Deaths	Possible 1 st degree murder charge	ONE charge for multiple people, not one each. Probably wouldn't stand up, but should be analyzed.: <i>Mens rea</i> and causation issues as above.
